Summary

We ask that authors follow some simple guidelines. We ask you to make your article look exactly like this document. The page format is A4, the text must be single column, line spacing – Single, left margin – 20 mm, right margin – 20 mm, top margin – 20 mm, bottom margin – 20 mm. A structure summary of article should describe the new and important aspects of the research, define the problem, the aim and the type of research; presented main results of research.

Keywords: list of keywords in an alphabetic order (font Times New Roman, letter size 12-point), the size of the keyword list should not exceed 5 keywords or phrases.

Introduction

This template provides authors with most of the formatting specifications needed for preparing electronic versions of their papers. Introduction should include topicality of the theme and significance of the problem is justified. It should not include methods, data or conclusions. The final sentence should clarify the aim of the article.

The text of the article

The recommended length of the article is till 6-8 pages, max length – one printer’s sheet. We impose a ban on articles that have been published already.




Figure 1. Insert caption to place caption

The lay-out: font Times New Roman, font size 12-point; the titles of the chapters shall be highlighted in Bold and centred; all drawings, tables and other non-text objects must be numbered and with titles. Insert figures and tables after they are cited in the text. Use the abbreviation “Fig. 1”.

All figures should be of good quality. Figure design: caption text centred – below the figures, font Times New Roman Bold, font size 12-point (Fig. 1).

Tables should normally be self-explanatory. Table design: caption above the table, font Times New Roman, Bold, font size 12-point (Table 1).

All citations in the text must be listed in the references and all references should be cited in the text. Literature references should be consistent, based on that same system around article. Reference citations should not appear in titles, summary and conclusions.

Conclusions

The conclusions should summarize the major findings of study. Speculation and unqualified statements should be avoided.
